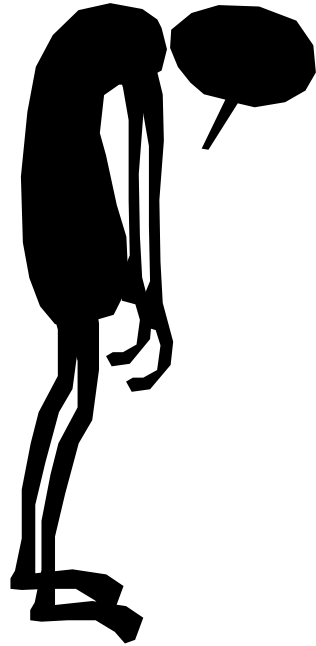


I Can Use My Words



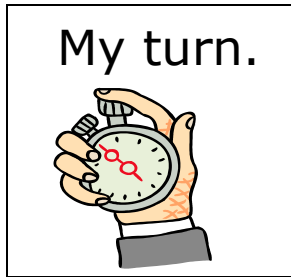

or by talking.

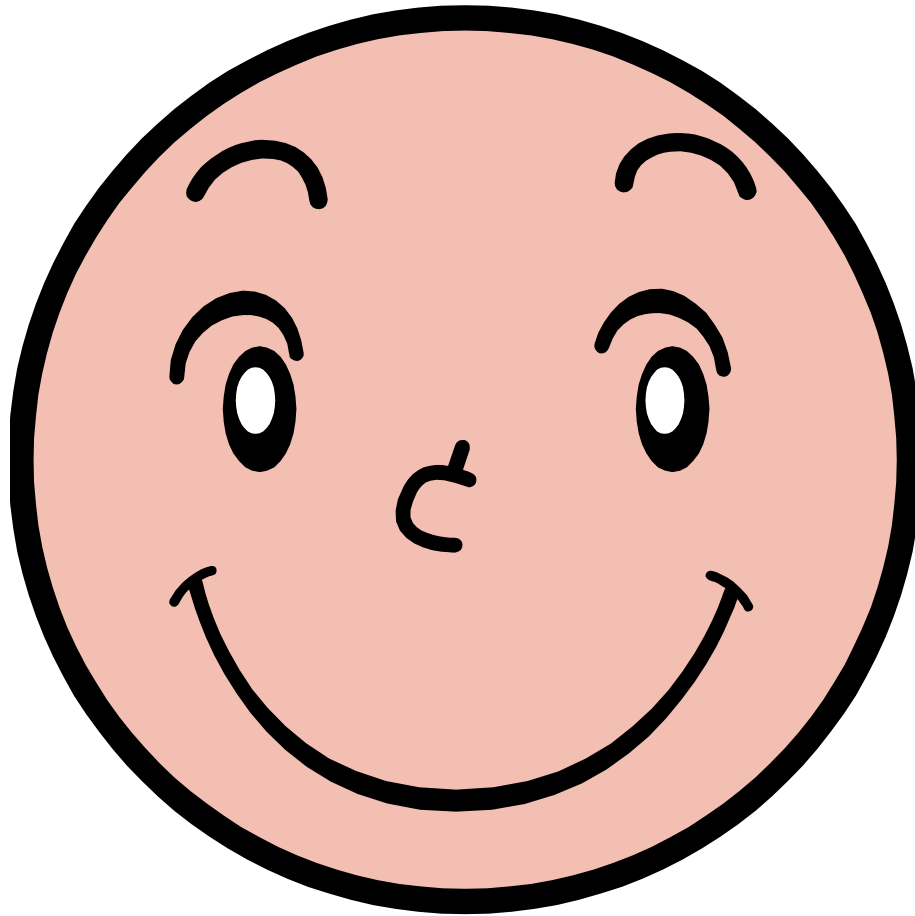


When I use words with people, they can understand what I am saying.

Help me please.

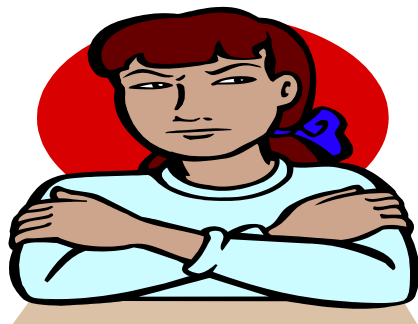
I can use words to ask for help.

People can have a hard time listening to me when I whine and scream.



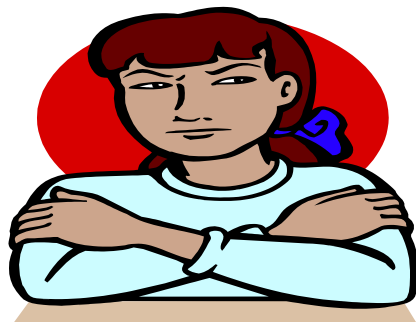


Whining and screaming can hurt people's ears.

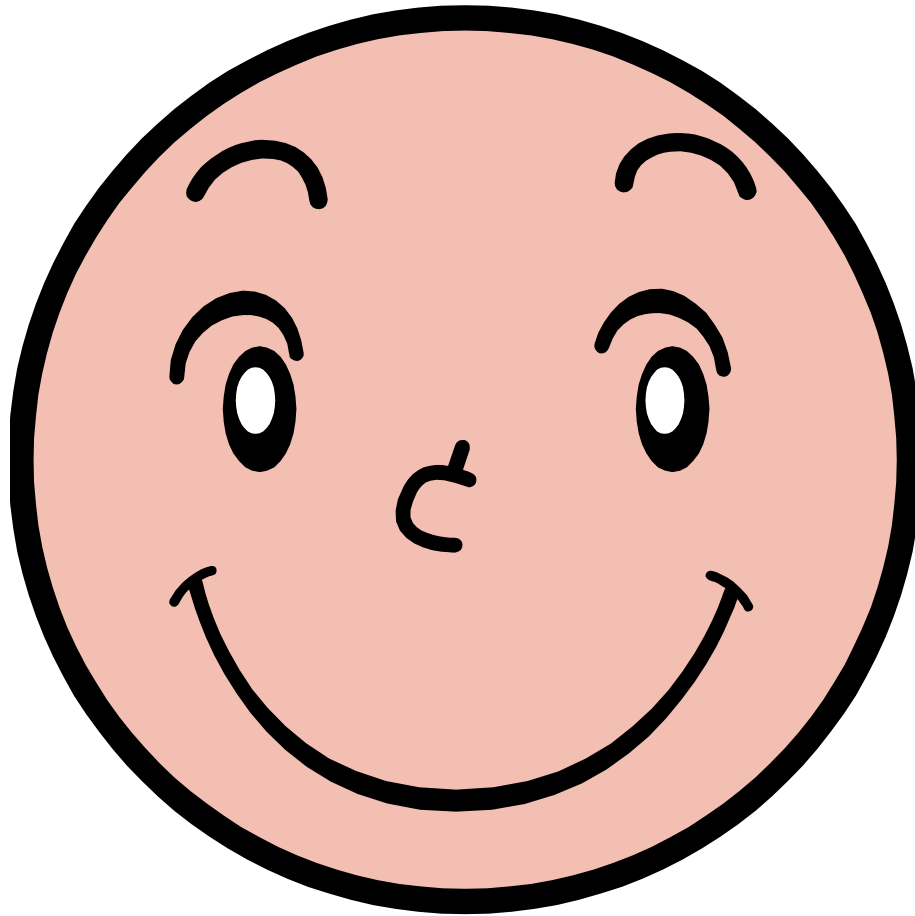




When I whine, scream, or cry,
